Depending on the weather the guide will chose which routes to do in the morning and the afternoon on the day. This ramble is graded as the easiest at Level One suitable for most types of accessible vehicles.

The meeting point is on the road which goes past the Bundu Campsite on the old road up to the former Prewley Moor Arms. Easy unloading of wheelchairs and Trampers here. There are toilets at the campsite and cycle hire.

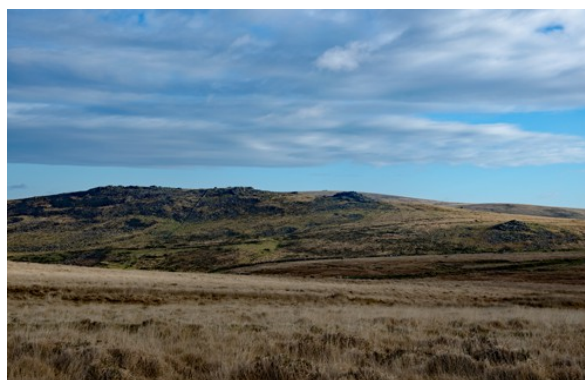

unloading facilities for scooters and free parking at the rear for customers.
Scooters are welcomed in her cafe and access is easy from the front and rear..
